The JAM superintendents and committee of the San Antonio Livestock show continues to strive to enhance and make improvements within our show. We will continue to emphasize the educational part of the show as well as the workmanship of each project.

ASABE Standards for tractor related projects

One of our educational objectives continues to be that students learn how to use professional engineering libraries such as the ASABE Technical Library for obtaining Standards in designing and constructing tractor related projects. The two ASABE standards required in the 2018 Premium list are available free to Texas Youth. Have students to click on <u>Additional Links</u> on home page of the jamshow.org web site. This will take them to a second page containing <u>Technical Library</u>. Click on this for instructions and codes for accessing and downloading the most recent Standards. Monthly Guest Access Codes are provided up through December 2017. Students should print out and use standards early in the design and construction of their project. The JAM rules require exhibitors with tractor related projects to include a copy of the revised Standards in the Research Section (16d) of the Projects Documentation.

JAM DIVISIONS and CLASSES

In order to improve competitiveness within divisions and create more incentives for students to participate with smaller starter projects, such as small trailers and outdoor equipment, we have expanded some of our divisions while keeping the more traditional ones.

By placing smaller type projects in their own division will allow exhibitors to compete against one another for a division award. We believe exhibitors will have a greater incentive to compete with starter projects and then grow their projects size and scope as they continue to compete at our show.
